At our Clinic, a team of people work together to provide patient care. As part of this team, you and your family will take part in making decisions and planning your care.

Residents and students	Hamilton Health Sciences is a “teaching hospital”, linked with McMaster University. Residents are doctors training to become Obstetricians. You may also meet students in medical, nursing or other health care programs. With your permission, students may be involved in your care.

Obstetricians and Gynecologists On-call

Dr. Campeau works with a group of Obstetricians and Gynecologists to provide patient care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If Dr. Campeau is not available, an Obstetrician or Gynecologist on-call will care for you.

Before your appointment

Before your appointment with Dr. Campeau, you may need to have an ultrasound scan or blood tests.

- Ultrasounds are done in the Antenatal Diagnostic Unit (4th floor, red section), the 4F Clinic, or in Diagnostic Imaging (2nd floor, yellow section).
- Blood tests and other laboratory tests are done at the Outpatient Laboratory (4th floor, yellow section).
- The Outpatient Laboratory is open:
Monday to Thursday: 8:00am to 5:00pm
Friday: 8:00am to 4:00pm

What to expect at the Clinic

When you arrive at the Clinic, please register with the Business Clerk. Make sure you bring your Ontario Health Card or other health insurance information to each visit. Let us know if you change your name, address or telephone number.

We will make every attempt to see you at your scheduled appointment time. However, your appointment may be delayed if your ultrasound or test results are not yet available or we have an emergency. We will try to make your waiting time as short as possible.

Maternity registration

If you are planning to give birth at Hamilton Health Sciences, you need to register at the Maternity Registration Clinic (4th floor, red section, across the hall from the 4F Clinic). The phone number to make this appointment is 905-521-2100, ext. 75082. This appointment is arranged for between 24 to 28 weeks of your pregnancy.

- **If you are less than 20 weeks pregnant or have a gynecological problem**, go to the Emergency Department (2nd floor).
- **If you are more than 20 weeks pregnant**, go to the Labour and Delivery Unit (4th floor).

If we are unavailable and you feel you have a medical emergency, it is best for you to come to the hospital.
