



## Palliative Medicine Position

We seek two Palliative Medicine Physicians for 2.0 FTE positions effective July 1, 2021, working in our Palliative Clinical Teaching Unit at St. Peter's Hospital. Working in conjunction with an interprofessional palliative care team, the successful candidates will provide palliative care as the Most Responsible Physician (MRP) to diverse, complex patient populations including oncology and general medicine patients who require End of Life Care in a hospital setting. Our CTU is currently a 60 bed unit staffed by a full interprofessional team consisting of palliative nurses, physiotherapists, OT's, dedicated pharmacists, social workers and spiritual support. The successful candidate will hold a clinical appointment in both the Department of Complex Care, Aging and Palliative Care and the Department of Family Medicine at Hamilton Health Sciences.

St. Peter's Hospital is a Complex Care hospital comprised of 235 Complex care beds (including the 60 palliative beds), providing care in 4 different programs: Restorative Care, Medically Complex Care, Behavioural Health and Palliative Care.

The successful candidates will seek a faculty appointment with the Division of Palliative Care in the Department of Family Medicine at McMaster University. The Division of Palliative Care is a leading academic organization responsible for the development and delivery of interprofessional initiatives in Palliative Care across all faculties and medical specialties at McMaster University and its partner sites.
