

## Going home after bronchoscopy or gastroscopy for HDR brachytherapy of the lung or esophagus

Today you have had a bronchoscopy or gastroscopy for brachytherapy of your lung or esophagus. Please read this information to learn how to care for yourself, what to watch for and when to get help.

## Frozen or numb throat

Your throat was frozen with a local anesthetic. The freezing may make it hard to swallow and to tell hot from cold.	
Do not eat or drink until (time). Before you start to eat or drink, ry a few sips of water at room temperature.	
You may have a hoarse voice or a sore throat. This is normal. When you are able o swallow, lozenges or gargling with warm salt water may be helpful.	е

## **Sedation**

For 24 hours, do not:

- drive
- operate machinery
- · drink any alcohol
- make any major legal decisions for 24 hours after treatment

## **Bleeding**

You may cough up a small amount of blood. This is normal. The amount of blood should decrease over the day.

When to get medical help
Call Dr (the doctor who did the broncoscopy or gastroscopy) if you notice any of the following problems:
<ul> <li>swelling of your face, throat or chest</li> <li>chest or stomach discomfort that does not go away or gets worse</li> <li>difficulty with breathing or swallowing</li> <li>an increase in the amount of blood you cough up</li> <li>chills and fever – a temperature over 38°C (100°F) or higher</li> </ul>
If you cannot reach the doctor, go to the nearest hospital Emergency Department.
