

After surgery instructions – child

If you were given handouts about your child's surgery, please review the information on caring for your child after surgery.

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Your child was last given pain medication at:

Give the next pain medication as directed by your surgeon.

Incision

- Keep the incision clean and dry.
- Your child should not soak in a bathtub or hot tub, or swim until the incision is fully healed or when your surgeon advises.

Dressing

Remove the dressing _	days after surgery. After your child
has a shower, pat the	ncision dry. If there are small white tapes on
the incision, do not ren	ove them. Let them fall off on their own.
Leave the dressing on	until your child's follow-up visit with the surgeon.

Stitches

- ☐ The stitches or staples are to be removed by your surgeon or family doctor.
- ☐ The stitches will dissolve on their own.

Activities

- If your child had surgery on an arm, hand, leg or foot keep it up (elevated) as much as possible to reduce swelling.
- Your child can slowly return to normal activities.
- Talk with your surgeon about when your child can return to school, start exercise and travel.

When do I need to get medical help?

Pain

Increasing pain not relieved by medication

Fever

Fever – a temperature of 38.5°C (101.3°F) or higher

Incision

- Increased swelling or redness around the incision
- Increased bleeding or drainage

Dehydration

- Passing much less urine (pee) than usual, or not passing urine by _____ am/pm.
- Continued vomiting
- Unable to drink or eat

If your child has any of these problems, contact your surgeon or family doctor. If you are unable to reach a doctor, go to an Urgent Care Centre or hospital Emergency Department.
