What is a Symptom Assessment?

The Symptom Assessment is a set of questions about how you are feeling now and how your activity has been over the past month.

Why should I complete my Symptom Assessment?

By completing a Symptom Assessment you will help us understand how you are feeling. We can identify problems and offer help.

When do I complete my Symptom Assessment?

Complete your Symptom Assessment before each doctor's appointment at the JCC. How you feel may change every day.

Where do I complete my Symptom Assessment?

There are touch screen computers in the Main Lobby, Clinics A through F, and in Radiation Review.

What do I do if I need help completing my Symptom Assessment?

Step-by-step instructions are posted at each computer and a Canadian Cancer Society Volunteer may be available to help you. You may also ask a family member, friend or caregiver to help.



How long does it take to complete a Symptom Assessment?

The first time you complete a Symptom Assessment takes about 5 minutes. After the first time, it takes about 2 or 3 minutes.

Can I complete my Symptom Assessment at home?

Yes. If you have a computer and a printer, you can complete and print your Symptom Assessment before coming to your appointment at the JCC by going to this link: <u>https://isaac.cancercare.on.ca</u>

Instructions

Instructions:

- 1. **Touch** the computer screen to begin.
- 2. Swipe or manually enter your Ontario Health Card number (no spaces, numbers only).
- 3. Press "Continue".
- 4. Complete all questionnaires:
 - Edmonton Symptom Assessment System – revised (ESAR-r)
 - Patient Reported Functional Status (PRFS)
- 5. Wait for scores to print at the designated printer
