

Making baby formula from powder



How to sterilize supplies




Wash your hands with soap and warm water.

Collect the supplies you will need:

- bottle
- knife


Wash all supplies in hot soapy water.



Rinse well.

Put the supplies in a pot with water.

Cover pot. Boil for 2 minutes.



Remove from pot and let supplies cool.

Making the baby formula




Wash your hands with soap and warm water.

Heat water in a pot or kettle to a rolling boil for at least 2 minutes. Do not use a kettle that shuts off before the water has boiled for 2 minutes.

If you are making powdered formula for a baby that is ill or less than 2 months old and premature or low birth weight – use the water within 30 minutes.

If you are making powdered formula for a healthy, full-term baby you can let the water cool to room temperature.


Sterilize water until your baby is at least 4 months old.



Read the label. Check that the expiry date has not passed.

Add _____ of cooled water into empty bottle.


Fill scoop from can and level with a knife.



Add _____ of powder to the bottle.

Shake bottle.

Put bottle in the fridge. Use within 24 hours.



Cover can with plastic lid.
Use within 1 month.

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
