Please bring:

- your health card with you
- a list of your current medications
- medications that you will need to take during your appointment including insulin and/or diabetic pills
- wear loose comfortable clothes. If possible avoid zippers, belts and wire under garments.

If you need to cancel your appointment, please call 905-577-1484.

Day of your CT scan

- Do not eat any solid food for 4 hours before your procedure. You may have clear fluids such as black tea or coffee, water or apple juice, until your appointment.
- Take your regular medications with water.
- Wear loose comfortable clothes. If possible avoid zippers, belts and wire under garments.
- Once you arrive for your CT scan, you will be given a mixture of water and clear x-ray dye to drink.

If you have diabetes – day of your CT scan

Do not eat any solid food for 4 hours before your procedure. You may have clear fluids such as black tea or coffee, water or apple juice until your appointment. Adjust your diabetic routine as needed.

If you need to take your diabetes pills or insulin with food while you are at the hospital for your procedure:

- Bring the medication and food with you to the hospital.
- Bring your insulin pen, blood glucose monitor and supplies to the hospital.
- Usually, you will be able to eat and take your diabetes medication, including insulin, within 1 to 4 hours after the procedure is done.
