

Going home after your esophageal dilatation

Today you have had an endoscopy and the doctor stretched the narrow part of your esophagus. The esophagus is the tube that connects your mouth and stomach. Here are a few things to watch out for.

Discomfort in your stomach or chest

You may feel pressure in your stomach like when you have to burp. This discomfort is due to the air that was put into your stomach during the endoscopy. This feeling will not last long. Burping is safe and may help you feel better.

When to call the doctor

Call the doctor who did your endoscopy or go to the nearest hospital emergency department if you have any of these problems:

- any swelling of your face, neck, throat or chest
- chest or stomach discomfort that does not go away or gets worse
- trouble breathing or swallowing
- chills or a fever your temperature is higher than 38.5°C or 101.3°F
- throwing up (vomiting) blood
