

What to expect on the Integrated Stroke Unit (ISU) - Acute Care

While in an acute care bed, you are in the early stages of your recovery. Your care is based on your individual needs. Taking part in your treatment is important to your recovery. This information will help answer questions you and your family may have about your care on the ISU.

<p>For your safety:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the side rails on your bed may be raised you will not be given anything to eat or drink until your ability to swallow has checked your movement may be limited until it is safe for you 	<p>For your safety:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> you may be taught to use new equipment and aids to help you care for yourself the health care team will help you increase your movement gradually 	<p>For your safety:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> you will be given information about safety equipment or aids that you may need to buy or rent
