
A Get ready

1. Choose the site for the injection

- The injection should go where you can pinch an inch of body fat to absorb the medication.
- Your stomach, the outside of your thighs and your outer upper arms are good choices for injection sites.
- Do not always pick the same spot. Choose a different site each week.
- Avoid scars, bruises, and red or swollen areas.
- Avoid the groin, joints and any veins you see.
- To reduce pain, a numbing medication (topical anaesthetic) can be put on the site about 30 minutes before the injection. If you would like to use this medication, please ask your doctor.

2. Choose a safe space to work

A flat, clean, dry, well-lit area works best.



3. Gather the supplies you will need:

Medication vial	Syringe and needle	Alcohol wipes	Sharps container
		ALCOHOL SWAB	SHARPS

4. Wash your hands

 The person giving the injection should wash their hands well with soap and warm water.



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
Prepare the needle and syringe

1. Clean the medication vial.

- If you're using a new vial, remove the protective cap and throw it away.
- Clean the top of the vial with an alcohol wipe. Throw away the alcohol wipe.

2. Prepare the syringe and needle.

- Push the connecting ends of the syringe and needle through their packages.
- Do not touch the connecting ends with your hands.
- Line up the connecting ends and twist to secure them together.
- Remove the protective coverings.




3. Put air into the vial

- Pull the plunger of the syringe back until it is level with the amount of your required dose of medication.
- Insert needle into medication vial. Push the plunger down to zero to inject air in the vial.
 Do not remove the needle.



4. Draw up the medication into the syringe

- Keep the needle in the vial and turn them upside down. The needle will now be pointing upwards.
- Pull down on the plunger to slowly "draw up" the medication liquid into the syringe.
- Check for air bubbles in the liquid. If you see bubbles, tap the syringe so the bubbles will float to the top.
- Push the plunger back up so the air bubbles go into the vial.
- Adjust the plunger (push up or pull down slightly) until the top of the black plunger is level with the amount of your required dose.
- Once you have drawn up the right dose of medication, turn the vial and needle back upright, keeping the needle in the vial.
- Slowly remove the syringe and needle from the vial.



Give the injection

1. Prepare the site for injection

- If you used numbing medication, wipe it away with a tissue.
- Clean the site with an alcohol swab.
- Pinch the skin at the site, but not too firmly.

2. Inject the needle

- Inject the needle straight down into the pinched skin (at a 90 degree angle).
- While keeping the needle in the skin, slowly push down on the plunger to inject all of the medication.
- Pull the needle and syringe straight out from the skin. Put them in the sharps container right away.
- If there is any blood at the site, wipe with a tissue or cover with a bandage.



3. Clean up

- Wipe up any spilled medication very carefully to make sure none is left behind.
- Anything that has touched the medication (syringes, medication vials, alcohol swabs or other materials) is medical waste and must be put in the sharps container.
- Clean the work space. Wash your hands with soap and water.
- Safely store all of the supplies until your next injection.

Other instructions:
