


Myeloma Chemotherapy - CYBORD

Drug	How drug is given	Day drug is given
Cy clophosphamide	Pills	1, 8, 15 and 22
Bor tezomib	Subcutaneous injection	
(Velcade)	-	
Dexamethasone	Pills	1, 8, 15 and 22

You will receive 4 to 6 cycles. Each cycle is 28 days or 4 weeks.

Your chemotherapy schedule may be delayed because of side effects.

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Possible side effects:

- Nausea and vomiting. Take anti-nausea medications as directed.
- Dexamethasone (steroid) side effects may include mood swings, irritability and difficulties with sleeping.
- Diarrhea or constipation.
- Numbness and tingling in fingers and toes.
- Rash.

What you need to know:

There will be a decrease in your blood cells. These include white cells, red cells, hemoglobin and platelets.

 You will be on an antiviral medication daily during treatment and for 6 months after treatment.

Call your Health Care Team if any side effects seem unexpected or extreme.

You will need a digital thermometer.

You can buy one at most drug stores.



If you have any of these signs of an infection call your Health Care Team right away:



- A temperature of 38°C or 100°F or more. This is a fever.
 DO NOT take Tylenol, Aspirin, ibuprofen or anti-inflammatory medications without checking with your team first.
 They may cause bleeding and may hide a fever. Call if you need medication for pain.
- A cough that produces coloured phlegm or sputum.
- Red inflamed skin.
- Diarrhea that does not go away.
- Increased shortness of breath.
- Pain or burning with urination.
- Sore throat.
- Signs of shingles: pain, blisters or a skin rash. It may look like chicken pox.

What to watch for:

- Unusual bleeding or bruising.
- Diarrhea that does not go away.
- No bowel movement for 3 days. Constipation. Use laxatives as needed. Do not use a suppository or enema.
- Increased thirst.
- Voiding (peeing) more often, or an increase in blood sugar.
- Numbness and tingling in hands and feet.
- Increased swelling of the feet and hands.
- Voiding (peeing) less.

We encourage you to:

- Watch the <u>chemotherapy video</u> and read the <u>chemotherapy book</u>.
- Eat and drink well (at least 2 litres of non-caffeinated fluids a day).
- Practice good hygiene.
- Practice good mouth care.
- Take Dexamethasone early in the day with food. Do not drink alcohol while on Dexamethasone.
- No green tea, grapefruit, pomegranate or star fruit.
- No Seville oranges for 24 hours before and after Velcade.

You will be on an antiviral medication during your treatment and 6 months after your treatment has ended.

Possible severe or long term side effects:

- Bone thinning/weakening.
- Potential future bone marrow damage.
