

<b>O</b> binutuzumab (Gazyva)	IV	Cycle 1: Day 1 and 2 are long infusion in ODS at Juravinski Hospital. Day 8 and 15 at JCC Chemo Suite. Cycle 2 to 6: Day 1 only at JCC Chemo Suite.

#### Possible side effects:

# \* You will NEED a pre-arranged driver to take you home from ODS on Day 1.

Potential for infusion reaction (fever, rash, low blood pressure, shortness of breath, chest or throat tightness) with first infusion.

- Rash
- Jaundice
- Nausea and vomiting (generally mild). Take anti-nausea drugs as prescribed.
- Cough and/or shortness of breath
- Diarrhea
- Fatigue

### What you need to know:

There will be a decrease in your blood cells. These include white blood cells, red blood cells, hemoglobin and platelets.

CALL your Health Care Team if any side effects seem unexpected or extreme.

# If you have any of these signs of an infection call your Health Care Team right away:



- A temperature of 38°C or 100°F or more. This is a fever.
   DO NOT take Tylenol, Aspirin, Ibuprofen or anti-inflammatory medications without checking with your team first. They may cause bleeding and may hide a fever.
   Call if you need medication for pain.
- A cough that produces coloured phlegm or sputum.
- Red inflamed skin.
- Diarrhea that does not go away.
- Increased shortness of breath.
- Pain or burning with urination.
- Sore throat.
- Watch for signs of shingles: pain, blisters or a skin rash. It may look like chicken pox.

#### What to watch for:

- Unusual bleeding. CALL your Health Care Team right away.
- Constipation (no bowel movement for 2 days). Use laxatives as needed. Do not use suppository or enema.

#### We encourage you to:

- Watch the <u>chemotherapy video</u> and read the <u>chemotherapy book</u>.
- Eat and drink well (at least 2 litres of non-caffeinated fluids a day).
- Practice good hygiene.
- Practice good mouth care.
- Take Dexamethasone early in the day with food. Do not drink alcohol while on Dexamethasone.



## Possible severe or long-term side effects:

- Potential of some hearing loss.
- Bone thinning/weakening.
- Potential future bone marrow damage.
- Potential infertility.
