#### **Maternal Fetal Medicine Clinic**

 The doctors working in the Maternal Fetal Medicine Clinic are specially trained Obstetricians called Maternal Fetal Medicine (MFM) Specialists. They provide care to women who have a complex medical history, fetal or maternal complications in their pregnancy.

# The Doctors on-call System

 The MFM Specialists work with a group of obstetricians and gynecologists to provide care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

- When your doctor is not available, another doctor is always "on-call" and will care for you.

## What to expect at your clinic appointment

Please bring the following with you to each clinic appointment:

- ✓ Your Ontario Health Card and any personal health insurance information.
- ✓ All of your medications (prescription, over the counter), vitamins and supplements that you are taking. We will review with you all of your medications at each visit.

When you arrive, check in with the Business Clerk. Let the Business Clerk know if you have changed your name, address or telephone number, or family doctor.

### **Appointment times**

- We will make every attempt to see you at your scheduled appointment time. However, your appointment may be delayed if your ultrasound or test results are not available or we have an emergency.
- We do have a number system in the clinic for your follow up visits that is used every day but Thursday. When you check in you will be given a number by the Business Clerk. This will help you have a better idea of when you will be seen.
- We will try to make your waiting time as short as possible. If there is a delay, you can leave your cell phone number with the Business Clerk, so you can walk around the hospital while you are waiting. We will call you when we are ready to see you.

### Having an ultrasound

- You may need an ultrasound scan before your doctor's visit. Ultrasounds may be booked in Diagnostic Imaging (2nd floor, yellow section), or in the Antenatal Diagnostic Unit (ADU), (4th floor, red section).
- Your appointment card will indicate where you will have your ultrasound.
   If your ultrasound is to occur in the ADU, please check in with Diagnostic Imaging on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and they will send you up to the 4<sup>th</sup> floor. There is a small waiting area by the windows just outside the red elevators.

### **Having laboratory tests**

When you need blood tests or other laboratory tests, you can have them done
in the Specimen Collection Centre at the hospital; located on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor,
yellow section, in the Boris Clinic or at your local community lab. There are
times when we will ask you have the test done in the hospital laboratory.

 All women delivering at HHS will need to complete registration forms to ensure we have your insurance information and your preferred accommodation details. These forms are available to print on the website\_and should be dropped off/mailed to Preferred Accommodation at the hospital.

- If you have questions during office hours, call the Maternal Fetal Medicine Clinic at 905-521-2644. A Business Clerk will direct your call or take a message for the appropriate team member.
- For concerns about your pregnancy after hours, call Labour and Delivery at 905-521-5050.
- If you are concerned about yourself or your baby it is best to come to the hospital for care. Call ahead to Labour and Delivery so they can get ready for you. The Labour and Delivery Unit is located to the left of the elevators on the 4th floor in the red section of the hospital.
