Volunteer Resources (VR) at Hamilton Health Sciences is a team of 7 Volunteer Management professionals who effectively engage a diverse population of Volunteers from the following hospital sites:

- Hamilton General Hospital
- McMaster Children's Hospital/McMaster University Medical Centre
- Juravinski Hospital/Juravinski Cancer Centre
- St. Peters Hospital
- Satellite Health Facility
- Urgent Care Centre
- Ron Joyce Children's Health Centre
- VR recruits over 600 volunteers per year
- Approximately 78,000 shifts are covered annually
- Over 75 placement opportunities
- In 2019, Volunteers contributed over 100,000 hours to HHS
- HHS Volunteers contribute to improved patient outcomes in complex and acute care settings
- HHS Volunteers share their lived experience to impact positive change at HHS through the Patient and Family Advisor program




Diversity & Inclusion



Requirements to Volunteer at HHS

- 14 years of age or older (or 13 years of age entering Grade 9)
- Complete an application form
- Complete volunteer onboarding (see Slide 4)
- Commit to a volunteer placement for a minimum of 50 hours (or 6 months)
- Attend scheduled volunteer shifts
- Provide \$10 uniform deposit (cash only, fully refundable)
- Adhere to Confidentiality and Terms of Engagement sign-off



Screening & Intake Process

- Online Application
- Consent for photography
- 2 Reference Questionnaires
- Health Screening & COVID-19 Vaccine
- Terms of Engagement sign-off
- Interview and placement
- Police Screening may be required (determined at interview)
- Orientation & training



Keep in mind...

- If selected to continue through the Volunteer Resources onboarding process, applicants will receive the registration package. Please note it can take 2-8 weeks to complete.
- Volunteers are selected and placed according to skills, interests, availability and suitability.
- Volunteers enhance the patient and family experience.
 Volunteers do not conduct or assist in roles that are performed by trained healthcare professionals.

Benefits of Volunteering at HHS
