



Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Clinician Teacher in the Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation Program

McMaster University and Hamilton Health Sciences is inviting applications for a clinician teacher in **Physical**Medicine and Rehabilitation (PM&R) to join the Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation Team at the Juravinski Hospital.

This position is best suited for those who have experience in bone, joint, muscle and cardiovascular rehabilitation. The successful candidate will join a group of highly skilled and motivated physicians and interprofessional team to supervise inpatient and outpatient care of patients after injury or illness.

The inpatient responsibilities are shared with PM&R physicians with support of a hospitalist and an interproressional team with access to a wide range of other specialties at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre. There is an integrated system of acute care consultation, 22 inpatient rehabilitation beds and wellness programs through association with the local YMCA.
